The Daniel House is the hallmark program of Samford Abroad. Students live, work, and study at the Samford- owned study center in South Kensington, London. ## Courses:




1. General Education Courses

These courses include credits in fine arts, humanities, social science and natural & computational sciences that most every student needs to graduate. These courses are usually 3-4 credits.




2. Language Courses

Many students are required to fulfill some language credits while others may be interested in pursuing a major or minor. Depending on the destination and how long a student chooses to study, 5-12 credits may be taken.






3. Department-Specific Courses

These courses vary based on term, faculty proposals, and student demand. Courses are typically between 3-4 credits and have included business, biology, education, health sciences, geography, classics, and more.



4. Internship

Daniel House students can participate in an internship in their area of study meanwhile advancing in thier academic curriculum. Internships may also be available on affiliate programs for students seeking professional international experience outside of London.

## Abundant Opportunities

### THE DANIEL HOUSE - *A Global Classroom*

The flagship of the Samford Abroad portfolio is the Daniel House, a five-story Victorian home in central London, roughly a mile from Kensington Palace. Students have the opportunity to live, work, and study in the Daniel House during faculty-led short-term and semester-long programs. Students study theatre, art, history, literature, and politics, all in one of the world's most connected global cities. Semester students also participate in an internship in their area of study.

### FACULTY-LED PROGRAMS - *An Innovative Education*

Faculty-led programs are short-term courses developed and led by Samford faculty and staff that typically focus on a specific subject area. Program leaders travel with a cohort of Samford students to learn and explore together. By design, these programs integrate group activities into the curriculum and provide a structured, enriching learning environment. Destinations vary year-to-year, but have previously included Spain, France, Italy, Greece, Costa Rica, Panama, Ecuador, Ireland, Israel, and the United Kingdom.

### AFFILIATE & EXCHANGE - *Limitless Possibilities*

Samford also offers opportunities for semester-long programs, as well as international internships, through affiliate and exchange programs. These partnerships prepare Samford students to further their education with the world as their classroom. Exchange and affiliate programs are perfect for students seeking an independent study abroad experience. With a variety of offerings, affiliate and exchange programs widen the possibilities of discipline and location.

### *The Journey to Samford Abroad*

1. Apply for a passport if you have not already. Remember you should have a passport with six months of validity to travel internationally.
2. Speak with a Peer Advisor for an overview of programs, deadlines, costs, dates, and next steps.
3. Speak with your academic advisor to determine which term works best for your schedule, which courses satisfy which credits, and if credit equivalencies can be applied.
4. Meet with the Samford Abroad Advisor to finalize your plans.
5. Submit your application at [abroad.samford.edu](http://abroad.samford.edu).
6. Wait to be accepted into program. Students may not be accepted if they do not meet qualifications or if class enrollment is maxed.
7. Attend pre-departure orientations and complete all necessary paperwork.
